Favorite memory: Santa Cruz hotel nights and Disneyland

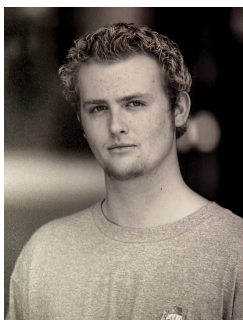

Special Shoutout: Shout out to my incredible friends, family, and boyfriend! Thank you for all your love and support.

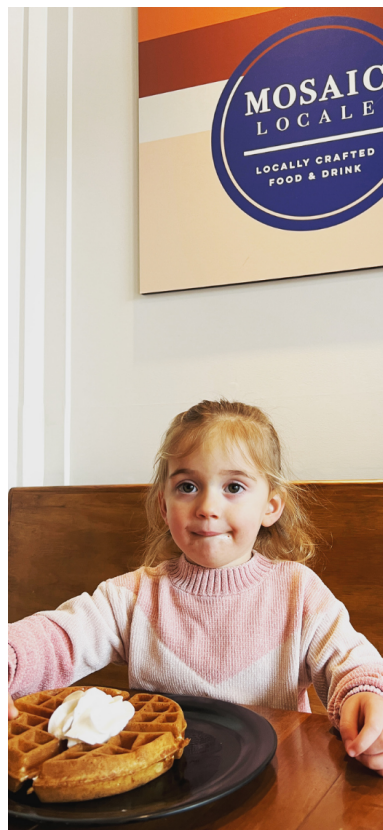
